Some birds fly across the ocean to find warmer land.




Before birds migrate they eat, eat, eat. They gain fat to give them energy for long journeys.

Bird migration can take a few weeks up to four months!




Some birds can fly as high as an aeroplane!


DOT-TO-DOT

Join the dots to discover who is in the picture. Start at number 1.




PICTURE RHYMES

Ranger Tabatha, Blink, Bronte, Snapper and Daisy walked together through the rainforest. They saw Toco perching on a tree branch.


'Boo hoo. Boo hoo. Boo hoo.' Daisy continued to cry.
